

DID YOU KNOW?

The leading cause of lead poisoning is dust from lead paint.

In 2018, it was estimated that 35% of U.S. homes contain some lead-based paint.

Dampness can lead to mold, which is a trigger for asthma.

Recent studies have suggested a link between early mold exposure and the development of asthma in children already predisposed to the condition.

Improper storage of cleaning supplies increases the risk of chemical exposure and poisoning, particularly in children.

In the first three months of 2020, poison control centers nationwide received 45,550 calls, most involving children under five years old.

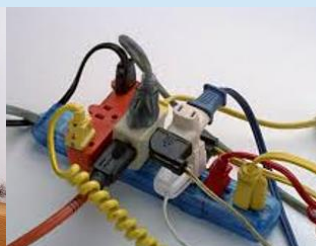
